These include delivery of the granite centrepiece, and the dedication of the memorial in late September, as the culmination of of a week of events, commencing with the opening of the Hayling Island WW2 Heritage Trail on Saturday 22nd September, at the HIADS Station Theatre.

In January, COPPist Roger Gilbert put us in touch with the Special Boat Service Association, who in turn approached their patron Countess Patricia Mountbatten on our behalf. The Countess is the daughter of Lord Louis Mountabtten, the former Head of Combined Operations, who set up the COPP unit late 1942. She expressed her

pleasure in agreeing to dedicate our COPP Heroes Memorial, and talked fondly of meeting members of COPP 6 prior to the D-Day operations.

She was most impressed by photographs of the completed memorial stone, and said she looked forward to thanking and congratulating stonemason lan Piper for his generous gift.


We still continue to find new friends and re-unite old comrades, and are now in
